Night Field Operations Log Entry February 17, 2009 Time Began: 18:30

Research team consisted of Sean Forker, Ernie Delp, Adam and Kat Cox. Location was AREA 001-A1/A-2. We parked the vehicles at the Gate going into the Summit (Area 001-A1).

We walked up the embankment to the first gridline on the Summit. It quickly became dark out; despite weather indications, visibility was not as excellent in terms of distance, at least in the woods.

Ernie began wood knocking, and we heard a single knock reply to our northeast. Adam and I heard brush movement to our rear right in the brush. We could not determine what moved through the brush, could have been something small. As a team, we moved to the northwest. Ernie and Kat decided to turn around and walk opposite of us that separated the cleared areas. We could see them on the other side of the brush. To test to see if we could hear something tear through the brush – Adam and I trampled through it. Conclusion: If anything would have moved through that brush, it would have made a loud noise.

We made our way back to the clearing, and went north. Ernie and Kat decided to check out the area we call the Woodland Circle. Adam and I stayed on the Ridgeline. After several minutes of them being in the circle, Kat radioed to us to say something was blocking their way out of the circle – between our locations. Adam and I immediately proceeded at the double quick to confront whatever was blocking their way out. We came across nothing. Very perplexing.

As we made our way back to the gate – to head over to the Gallery – we came upon a noise which sounded like a high pitched steady alarm. Ernie tried to use a shotgun mic to record the sound – but it ceased as he activated the recorder. Before we left this side of the Ridgeway, we tried some more knocking – with once again a solitary knock coming from our forward left wooded area.

The team moved off into the hillside on the Ridgeway – where Kat and I positioned ourselves as Ernie and Adam proceed to the Gallery. Kat and I began to vocalize "Sensual" sounds, while Adam and Ernie wood knocked. A loud "GRRF" sound was heard in the front of our position, about 15 feet. I immediately yelled for Ernie and Adam to rejoin– as I felt threatened and uncomfortable.

After several minutes we decided to split up again, with Adam and Kat remaining on the Hillside and Ernie and I down towards the Gallery. Immediately as Ernie and I get settled, we get a call on the radio from Adam saying "That someone is up there with them. They can see a person moving towards them from the end of the field." Feeling unnerved – they joined us down at the Gallery – and we proceed back up the Hill to exit the area.

On our way out – we maintained distance between the groups (20 ft between each other) – something was heard stalking Ernie and Kat from the brush. I spotlighted the whole area but found nothing. We hiked back to the cars.

We discussed the events and decided that no matter the group mix – Kat seemed to be the agent of attraction. Suggestion is that we use even more small groups and more female mix to see if we can get the same results- possibly even use an all female group. Also to note that several times throughout the evening, we smelled a sweet, musky type odor in the areas near us.
